

Herbs and shrubs shall also form a part of afforestation programme besides tree plantation. 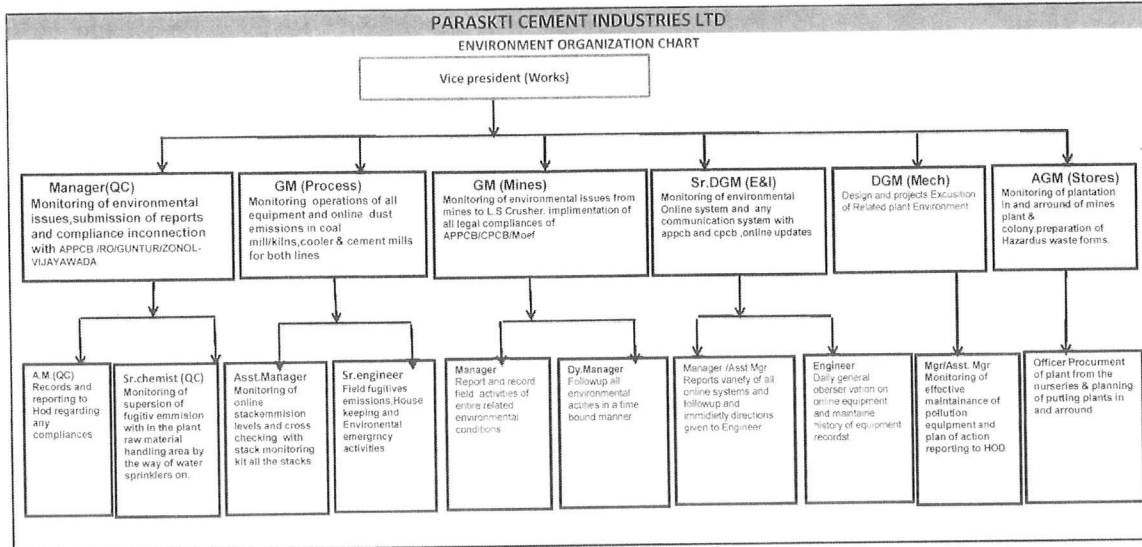

Graft issue: TDP objects to YSR's remarks

VIJAYAWADA: TDP official spokesperson Nammapaneni Rajakumari on Tuesday took strong objection to the Government's reactions in the aftermath of startling allegations made by the former Vigilance Commissioner, R.C. Samal.

Addressing a press conference here, Ms. Rajakumari said instead of taking any concrete action to root out corruption, Chief Minister Y.S. Rajasekhara Reddy sought to defend the "black sheep in his Cabinet." On the other hand, Dr. Reddy was levelling baseless allegations against TDP president N. Chandrababu Naidu.
