**NOISE LEVELSAT HAULAGE ROAD ( DB ) AT LIME STONE MINE**



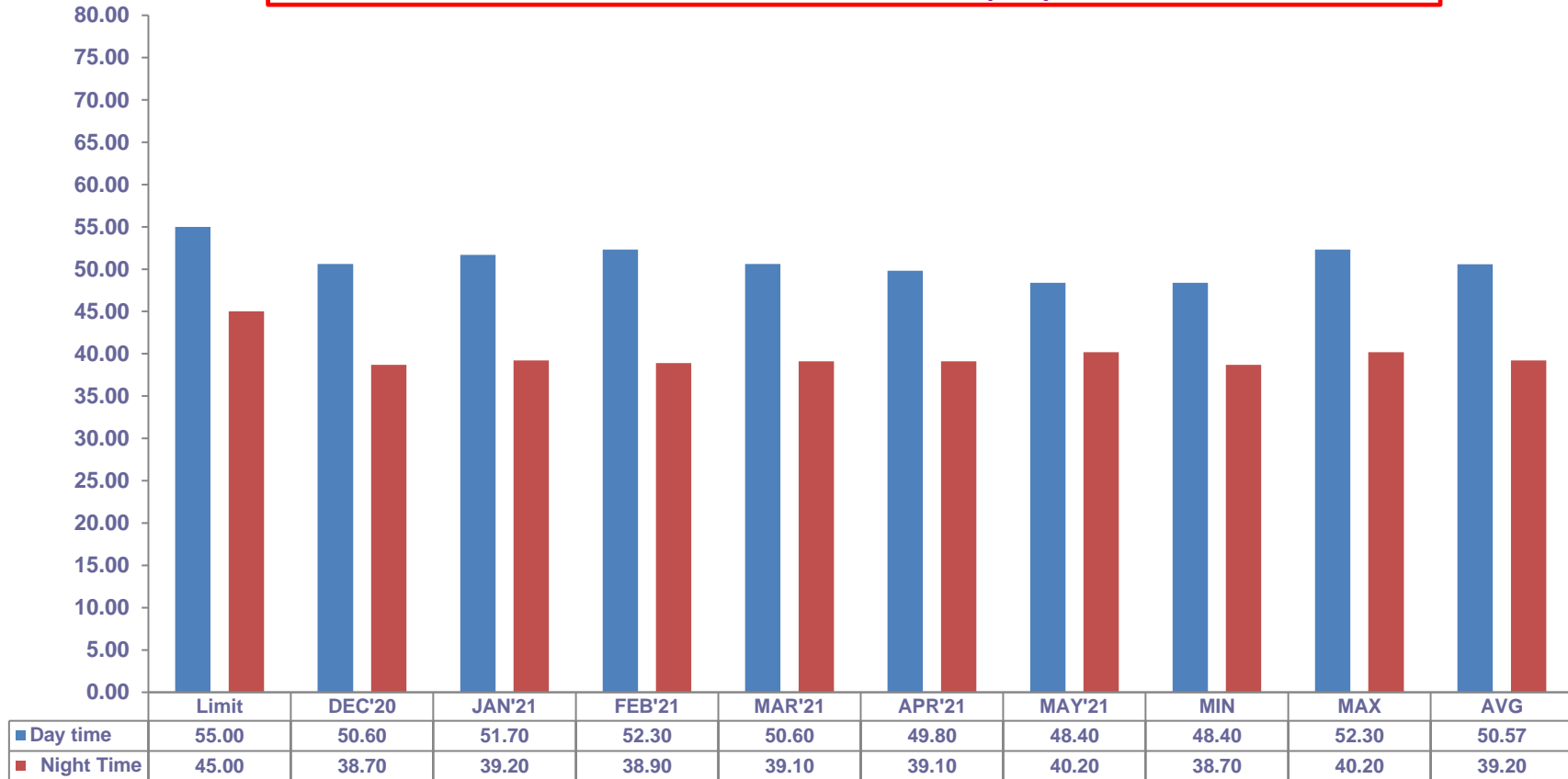

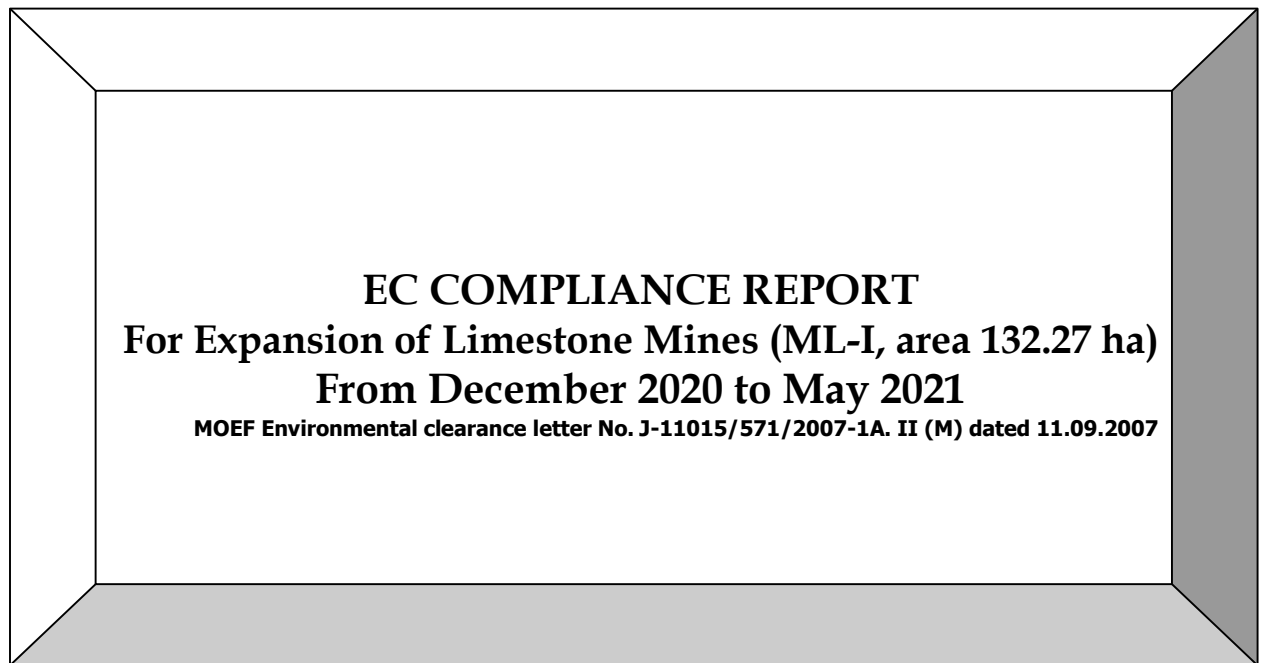
